



MARINA GUIDELINES

We have a great time here at Constitution Marina and we will do everything in our power to ensure that you enjoy your time with us. Constitution Marina is a close-knit community. In such a small, restricted environment we must be mindful of our neighbors and their sensibilities. In order to make your stay as enjoyable as possible and to accommodate everyone's wishes to the best of our ability we would like to take this opportunity to restate some of the rules and courtesies that enable all of us to enjoy the boating season:

- **The Golden Rule** prevails. We are a small community often separated by only a few inches. Be considerate of your neighbors. Keep noise levels down and at a minimum after 11 PM.
- **Wakes!** We are responsible for those waves we leave behind our boats as we approach the marina.
- **Dock carts** are designed for light use. Do not overload or transport fuel or batteries.
- **Delivered Packages** should be scheduled during office hours. The marina will sign for your delivery and hold your package in a designated area for a short period. Large package must be picked up ASAP. The marina is not responsible for damaged or missing packages.
- **Barbecue stations** are available on the pool deck. The fire department and the marina will not allow any grilling on boats or docks at the marina.
- **Trip and fall hazards** are the most common cause of accidents at marinas. Please make sure that cords, hoses, and lines are neatly coiled and stowed. Do not wrap them around pedestals or nail them to the docks.
- **Dock boxes and boat step/stairs** must be of approved size and material and must not be secured to the dock. Ask the Dockmaster for details.
- Hoses, power cords, and dock boxes are the only items that should make their home on the docks. All extraneous items belong on the boat.
- **Electric cords** must be disconnected from the pedestal when the boat is not at the dock.
- **Dinghies** are not allowed on docks or finger piers and cannot be locked in a slip. We have dinghy racks available if you are not able to stow your dinghy on your boat.
- **Signs** are not permitted on boats at the marina. For Sale signs, vendor signs or any others are not allowed.
- Please do not dispose of waste oil, batteries, shrink-wrap or any other **hazardous materials** in the dumpster. Ask us about proper disposal.
- **Parking** in the marina lot is by **permit only**. Day passes may be available. Marina parking, by permit, is to the right of the guard shack as you enter. Parking is **not** permitted in the office parking lot without paying Constitution Plaza.
- All outside **contractors** must check in with the Dockmaster before working on any boat at the marina. Contractors must have a proof of insurance on file at the marina office prior to entering the docks.
- The use of the **pool** deck and tent area is for all to enjoy. If you want to reserve a portion of the deck for a party of 15 or more please make advance arrangements. Children under the age of three are not allowed in the pool.
- We love **pets**, but they don't often clean up after themselves so that becomes the owners duty. Please keep pets on a leash - "Mutt Mitts" are available. Sorry, no pets on pool deck or in the restrooms.
- **Life jackets** must be worn by children under the age of five while walking the docks.
- **Heat tape** (winter season only) must be wrapped around all water feeds hard plumbed into your boat. Heat tape must be kept on at all times.
- During **inclement weather**, we take all necessary precautions to secure the marina and your boat, although the owner is responsible for vigilance.
- **Let us know your cruising plans so we can ensure your slip is open for you when you return.**
